



EUROPEAN PLATFORM OF RECEPTION AGENCIES (EPRA)

BRIEFING NOTE

December 2015

BACKGROUND

EU reception administrations are confronted with very similar challenges related the day-to-day management of a reception network. Strategic management choices relating to the implementation of a (national or EU) reception policy are sometimes made with a limited consideration for and a limited knowledge of similar developments elsewhere in Europe. A platform of European administrations, through the gathering of management expertise and the dissemination of acquired management knowledge, would have a real added value.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PLATFORM

The objective of the platform of EU MS administrations responsible for the implementation of EU and national asylum reception law is to stimulate strategic information sharing on a senior management level, compilation of information, identification and monitoring of best practices with a view to efficient and informed management of asylum reception in the EU.

EXPECTED RESULTS OF THE PLATFORM

Expected results of the platform include:

- Establishment of a permanent, high-quality information flow on different issues linked to the organisation of reception towards partner organizations.
- Fostering consultation on strategic management level, including the definition and evaluation of management strategies in all their nuances and the exchange of key operational information related to asylum reception.
- Continuous capacity and know-how development of asylum reception administrations in specific aspects of the management of a reception network through the building of a "European community of best practices" based on the sharing and joint monitoring of reception management practices.

MAIN ACTIVITIES OF THE PLATFORM

Main activities include:

- Organization of 2 full rounds/Expert meetings per year in Brussels and EASO-Malta to foster strategic consultation (top management level) between EU reception administrations.
- Organization of 2 thematic working groups (middle management and expert level) in each of the participating organizations.

EPRA thematic focus includes (non-exhaustive):

- reception budget efficiency and flexibility
- integration of reception in the asylum- reception-return chain
- defining, measuring and managing an appropriate reception capacity
- the measure of reception performance, incl. indicators at operational and policy level
- the work with decentralized actors, either non-profit partners or private contractors.

The Bulgarian State Agency for Refugees, the Czech Refugee Facilities Administration of the MOI, the Danish Immigration Service, the Italian Ministry of the Interior and the Maltese Agency for the Welfare of Asylum Seekers the Cypriot Asylum service of the Ministry of Interior and the Government of Luxembourg, Office for Reception and Integration were also associated to some activities. The objective is to progressively extend the platform to other interested European (Member) States (reception administrations or alike). (Future) Candidate Member States can be associated to the activities as observers (e.g. the Serbian Commissariat for Refugees).

OTHER STAKEHOLDERS

EPRA collaborates with the European Asylum Support Office (EASO) conform to its mandate. EPRA liaises with other relevant initiatives such as ENARO¹ and international forums such as IGC and GDISC for the reception issue. EPRA outcomes are disseminated to various stakeholders (EC, other relevant initiatives, etc.) based on a plan for dissemination.

EPRA COORDINATION

EPRA is coordinated by FEDASIL, hosting the EPRA coordination team. EPRA coordination team is supported by national reference points in each partner organizations in order to guarantee a proper level of investment, information sharing and expertise from partner organizations.

LONG TERM PERSPECTIVE

EPRA is conceived as a long term initiative. The first phase (2011-2012) largely focused on the set-up of the platform with a number of core countries and installed the strategic exchanges mechanisms and the community of practices based on a number of themes. The second phase (2013-2015) will be focused on consolidation of structure and results (also through the support of the Belgium national ERF programme). At the end of this phase, partner organizations will be invited to reflect on and define a longer term perspective for EPRA to guarantee the sustainability of outcomes.

The platform, through the establishment of coordination and exchange mechanisms, will foster sustainable operational connections and confidence between reception administrations.
